May they never be separated from these.

I myself will cause them never to be separated from these.

Please, Guru-Deity, bless me to be able to do this.

How wonderful it would be if all sentient beings were to achieve buddhahood. May they achieve buddhahood.

I myself will cause them to achieve buddhahood.

Please, Guru-Deity, bless me to be able to do this.

## Mantra to Increase Virtue

## OM SAMBHARA SAMBHARA BIMANA SARA MAHA DZAWA HUM / OM SMARA SMARA BIMANA SKARA MAHA DZAWA HUM (7x)

Reciting this mantra increases by one hundred thousand times any virtue collected with your body, speech, or mind during the day. This is according to the *Sutra of the Wheel of Complete Dedication*.

May I be an island for those who seek one And a lamp for those desiring light, May I be a bed for all who wish to rest, And a servant for all who want a servant.
